Stewardship

What is Per Capita??

Perhaps one of the most confusing aspects of how the Presbyterian Church functions is "per-capita". Each year our church encourages its members to pay their per-capita apportionment. Why do we do this? Where does this money go?

One of the great strengths of our denomination is its connectionism. We who worship at Hope Presbyterian Church are tied to the larger church in ministry. One concrete form of that connection is through our per-capita. Every Presbyterian Church in the country is required to pay a certain amount for each active member on its rolls. This money goes to support the work and ministry of our church throughout the country. Each governing body above the Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the church. Unlike pastors, these individuals have no congregation to support their ministry. Although their ministry may not be as "glamorous" as missionary work in South America, they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church. These are the people who prepare the curriculum that our children use, the offering materials that we receive, and countless other resources.

For the year 2007, our per-capita apportionment is \$30.84 which is split for the work of the Presbytery of Monmouth and our General Assembly.

Many people view per-capita as their "membership dues" to the church. **This is not true.** The church is not like a fraternal or service organization that will dismiss their members for unpaid dues. Yes, the church is required to pay its per-capita to the large church.

Many congregations encourage their members to help by inviting them to pay their own per-capita along with their regular giving. If members of the church are unwilling or unable to pay, then the church will use other funds to complete its per-capita commitments. At Hope, this means dipping into more of our savings, which as you know is very limited.

Consider prayerfully that per-capita is not dues to be paid to the church, but rather a form of mission giving to the larger work of the Presbyterian Church.

Pledges for 2008

During September, Pastor Andrew focused on many aspects of Christian Stewardship. The month ended with Loyalty Sunday where we pledged our faith gifts for 2008.

The good news is we have received 41 pledges for the Operating account totaling \$61,112.00 and 28 pledges for the Building Fund (Honoring our Debt) totaling \$19,400.00. Compared to last year, we are short over \$7000.00 in pledges for the Operating account and short \$1600.00 in our Building Fund.

Yes, this is a bit disheartening. Essentially this means we will be depleting more of our savings next year to pay bills. Our savings account took a big hit this year and at the rate we are going, it will be depleted by June of next year. This also means that there will be budget cuts in all areas of the church should we fall short of what we need to cover for next year.

The Building Fund is used for our mortgage payment which is \$2765.70 per month. Annually that means we need to pay \$33,188.40. So if pledges are at \$19,400.00 now, that means there is a shortage of \$13,788.40. This year alone, we have not always met our monthly payment and have had to take from savings to cover it, even with the Korean Congregations generous monthly gift. If we were able to meet the monthly mortgage payment each month, we would be able to use what the Korean Congregation donates to us (\$1000.00 per month) for something extra. The Building fund is a monthly donation (blue envelopes). Please prayerfully consider this when making your pledge for next year.

Please prayerfully consider what God has given you and remember that Hope's mission in the community is crucial. God gives us so much. Let us honor Him in 2008 with all we can faithfully and wholeheartedly give back, to glorify Him!
