## **THE PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Family and Friends of Hope Church,

This Sunday marks the beginning of the Advent season in the Church Year. For those of you who may have never heard, Advent is a season of preparation. The first Sunday in Advent signifies the beginning of what is known as the Christian year – the various seasons we observe, as Advent, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost, that mark out a Christian's journey through the life of Jesus Christ on earth and in heaven. These days of Advent, leading up to Christmas Day, are days of preparation and expectation.

The word 'advent' is Latin for 'a coming or arrival'. The idea behind it is that God came to earth and lived among us (which, if you stop and think about it, is a really big deal). It's something to celebrate, rejoice, because just by being in it, God was giving the greatest blessing to the created world.

Yet this birth led to the death of this same God, by us on behalf of us, and then the greatest news that death will not end it all. So it's not something you just go rushing into. We need to take stock of what that baby Jesus was here for.

God loves and wants to share that love with this broken and hurting world. So, to heal this broken world, so full of sin and defined by death, God chose to come here and walk the earth... to grow up... to live the truth... and ultimately to die. To do this, God had to start out as a baby, and the only way to be a baby is to be born. Hence Christmas.

But Advent is not just about the birth of the baby Jesus. Yes, by celebrating Advent we are thanking God for Christ's first coming. But we are also preparing for his final coming at the end of time, AND we are celebrating Christ's presence among us today through the Spirit. Thus, these are days defined by Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy.

In the end, Advent functions as both a reminder, and a calibration of the great mystery that has been proclaimed by the Church since its very beginning: "Christ was born. Christ has risen. Christ will come again."

In this season of Advent, may Christ's Grace and Peace be with you.

## Bible 101

For the last 8 weeks a group of Hope congregants have met on Sunday evenings to explore the Bible. The Bible 101 class, led by Pastor Tibert and Marilyn Hicken, offered participants religious education, historical perspective of the Bible, and fellowship.

The religious education provided in Bible 101 followed the format of the book *30 Days to Understanding the Bible*, by Max Alder, D.Min. Dr Alder’s format allowed laymen to understand the structure of the Bibles’ books, Psalms and Epistles. Most important, students learned how the Bible chronicles the highs and lows of God’s relationship with man from the Creation through the prophecies documented in Revelation.

Throughout the course, Pastor Tibert and Marilyn explained the historical context of events studied in the guidebook and the Bible. Through their expert explanations, attendees were able to gain an understanding of “where” and “when” the key figures of the Bible lived, traveled, and spread the message of God. These examinations of the history and geography surrounding the many stories we knew from the Bible added great interest and comfort to those of us who were admittedly challenged by geography.

As important as the religious and historical perspectives was the fellowship of the attendees of Bible 101! The low-key setting and pace of the program provided a supportive climate for all participants to ask questions and air opinions with the group. Many participants offered their unique insight to the lessons in ways that helped everyone understand God’s messages. The old adage “none of us is as smart as all of us” applied to the group’s learning.

Bible 101 concluded the final Sunday in November and certainly, the participants are already looking forward to future programs. Many thanks to Andrew, Marilyn and all the program’s attendees!
